UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following

O R D E R

1. We have heard learned counsel for the petitioner at a considerable length.

2. In our considered view, no case to interfere with the order passed by the Civil Court, as affirmed by the High Court, regarding the impleadment of respondent No.2 in the civil suit as co-plaintiff, who is husband of respondent No.1, is made out in exercise of powers under Article 136 of the Constitution of India.

3. Faced with this, learned counsel for the petitioner points out that an ex-parte temporary injunction restraining the petitioner

and other media houses was issued by the trial court on 17.06.2023

and the same is still operative. We are informed that the petitioner or other affected parties have already filed the reply

to the application for ad-interim injunction.

4. Taking into consideration all the attending circumstances and without expressing any opinion on merits, we direct the trial court to dispose of the said application expeditiously and in accordance with law.

5. The Special Leave Petition is disposed of, in the above terms.

6. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
