## I.A. 15376/2025 (u/s 12A of Commercial Courts Act)

1. As the present suit contemplates urgent interim relief, in light of the judgment of the Supreme Court in *Yamini Manohar* v. *T.K.D. Krithi*, 2023 SCC Online SC 1382, exemption from the requirement of pre-institution mediation is granted.

11. Let the plaint be registered as a suit.

12. Issue summons in the suit and notice in the application for interim injunction.

13. Mr. Sai Krishna Rajagopal, counsel accepts summons in the suit and notice in the application on behalf of the defendant and waives issuance of formal summons.

14. Written statement to the plaint and reply to the application for interim





injunction shall be filed by the defendant within thirty (30) days from today. Along with the written statement, the defendant shall also file affidavit of admission/ denial of the documents of the plaintiff, without which the written statement shall not be taken on record.

15. Liberty is given to the plaintiff to file replication, if any, within thirty (30) days from the receipt of the written statement. Along with the replication filed by the plaintiff, affidavit of admission/ denial of the documents of the defendant be filed by the plaintiff.

16. Rejoinder, if any, to the reply to the present application filed by the defendant shall be filed within two (2) weeks after the receipt of such reply.

17. The parties shall file all original documents in support of their respective claims along with their respective pleadings. In case the parties are placing reliance on a document which is not in their power and possession, its details and source shall be mentioned in the list of reliance, which shall also be filed with the pleadings.

18. If any of the parties wish to seek inspection of any documents, the same shall be sought and given within the timelines.

19. List before the Court on 27<sup>th</sup> August, 2025 for consideration of the application for interim injunction.
